Class	This week we have	Next week	
Wrens	This week in Wrens our story of the week was 'Marvin Gets Mad'. We have been discussing what makes us angry and how we can find strategies to calm ourselves. We have been learning the poem 'A Bas- ket of Apples' and acting it out. In maths our focus has been sorting. We have been making compari- sons between objects relating to size. We have played some listening games with activities to strengthen our fingers ready for writing.	Next week in Wrens we will be reading the story 'Ten Little Robots' and practising saying number names in order up to ten. We will learn the poem 'Owl' and act it out. We will be matching numi- con shapes and comparing objects according to size. We will practise clapping the number of sylla- bles in our names and talking about which names have the most syllables in. We will continue to look for the signs of Autumn.	
Robins	We have been exploring the book "The Leaf Thief". In maths we have been looking at the composition of 3 & 4 and have been busy learning a harvest song ready for our Harvest Stay and Play.	Next week our book will be 'The Little Red Hen'. We will be having a go at joining in the refrains and retelling the story. We will also be looking for- ward to our Harvest Stay and Play where we will get the chance to play at school with our parents and carers. We will also sing them a special song. In maths we will be exploring the different ways of making 4 and continuing to use our 'fast eyes' to subitise.	
Woodpeckers and Kingfishers	Woodpeckers and Kingfishers have been building model houses. They will be Tudor houses just like during the Great Fire of London. On Friday after- noon, we lined up the houses on the playground and set fire to them, watching how quickly fire spreads. The Fire department came in to put the fire out and talked to the children about fire safety.	Next week, Year 1 will be starting their art lessons, focusing on Fauvism. We will be learning new skills such as colour mixing and creating a piece of art at the end of the week. Year 2 will be continuing their work on the Great Fire of London and writing a Diary entry as if they were there in 1666.	
Puffins and Gannets	Puffins have been moving forward with their place value knowledge by learning to compare numbers with three digits. They have been excited to observe the plants from our science investigation and see if they can really find out what plants need to grow. In PSHCE, they have been thinking about personal identity and how own strengths can help others. Year 4 have been developing their English grammar by strengthening how to use conjunctions, preposi- tions and clauses in our everyday writing and how to spot them as language detectives when reading. We have also been conducting a plant investiga- tion. We have hypothesized as to what will happen when we try to nurture the same plant in five differ- ent places. Our predictions are based on what a plant will need to grow and survive. In RE and PSHCE we have continued to understand, acknowledge and enjoy learning about different faiths, cultures, customs and family units and respect individuality.	Puffins will be doing further work on their non chronological reports. They will be thinking more closely about Stonehenge and how it was built, as well as looking at the Iron Age and how the daily life of humans progressed through this interesting period in history. In art, we will be refining our sketching skills to create some of our own cave art. After an exciting week creating giant cave draw- ings using only natural materials such as sticks, bark and stones we are going to develop this further next week and complete enquiries into the everyday lives of the Stone Age people. What they ate, wore, how they entertained their chil- dren and how they worked out how to make bronze. I n PSHCE we have been taking a deeper look at our inner superhero, who we are and what special powers we have, what makes us who we are. Next week we will build upon this further and celebrate our own individuality. Science is very exciting as we have two experiments on the go. One is watching a plant in five different environ- ments and conditions, the other is working out how a plant takes water at the roots and distrib- utes it right to the tips of its petals.	
Falcons and Ospreys	Year 5 and 6 have continued their spooky story writ- ing experience with the aim of producing an amaz- ingly eerie narrative inspired by a spooky video. We have continued to read more short stories from the Anthony Horrowitz Horror collection, with 'The Lift' being this week's read. We have conducted our properties test that we have thoroughly planned in Science, dug deeper into Viking art and investigated how the Vikings travelled. In maths, Year 5 have continued to deeper their understanding of number through addition and subtraction. Year 6 have been investigating multiplication and division initially focus- ing on common multiples and factors.	Next week, Year 5 and 6 will continue to delve into the delightful horror in Anthony Horowitz's stories, reading 'Killer Camera' over the next week. In writing, we will edit and improve our horror sto- ries that have been inspired by a short horror film, and begin to plan our own, unique horror stories, ready for our writing competition. In history, we will continue to look at the Vikings and will learn why they chose to settle in Britain, the significance of the Danelaw and the Treaty. In maths, Year 5 will continue our journey through the wonderful world of addition and subtraction. Year 6 will have more of a focus on prime numbers before we move on to multiplication.
