Class	This week we have	Next week			
Wrens	This week in Wrens we have been reading the story 'Ten Little Robots' and practising saying number names in order up to ten. We have been learning the poem 'Owl' and acting it out. We have matched numicon shapes and compared objects according to size. We have practised clapping the number of syllables in our names and talking about which names have the most syllables in. We have continued to look for the signs of Autumn.	Next week in Wrens we will be reading the story 'Baby Goes to Market' and counting all the things that Baby collects at the market. We will have our own role play market and take turns being customers and sellers. We will learn the poem 'Things I can do' and act it out. In maths we will make comparisons between objects relating to size and explore 2D shapes.			
Robins	This week our book has been 'The Little Red Hen'. We have been having a go at joining in the refrains and retelling the story. We have also been looking forward to our Harvest Stay and Play, where we got the chance to play at school with our parents and carers. We sang them a special song. In maths we have been exploring the different ways of making 4 and continuing to use our 'fast eyes' to subitise.	We are looking at the book 'Supertato' and discussing how we can help each other. In Maths, we will be comparing objects and using the language more and fewer.			
Woodpeckers and Kingfish- ers	This week Year 1 have started their art lessons, focusing on Fauvism. We have been learning new skills such as colour mixing and created a piece of art at the end of the week. Year 2 have been continuing their work on the Great Fire of London and writing a Diary entry as if they were there in 1666.	Next week we will be reading the book 'Pumpkin Soup' and looking at seasonal changes. The children will learn about different weather patterns and make a wind sock. We will be exploring the different characters in the book and going on an Autumn walk.			
Puffins and Gannets	Puffins have been doing further work on their non chronological reports. They have been thinking more closely about Stonehenge and how it was built, as well as looking at the Iron Age and how the daily life of humans progressed through this interesting period in history. In art, we have been refining our sketching skills to create some of our own cave art. After an exciting week creating giant cave drawings using only natural materials such as sticks, bark and stones we have been developing this further this week and completed enquiries into the everyday lives of the Stone Age people. What they ate, wore, how they entertained their children and how they worked out how to make bronze. In PSHCE we have been taking a deeper look at our inner superhero, who we are and what special powers we have, what makes us who we are. This week we have been building upon this further and celebrating our own individuality. Science has been very exciting as we have had two experiments on the go. One is watching a plant in five different environments and conditions, the other is working out how a plant takes water at the roots and distributes it right to the tips of its petals.	Gannets are proud to be working on column addition with exchanging numbers next week. We thoroughly enjoy the challenges that problem solving in math's brings. We are also designing and making a model of a Stone Age Hillfort. It will have models of huts, fields, workshops and cooking areas. We will also continue with our self journeys on what makes us unique and special, we are celebrating all of the super strengths that we have within. RE is one o our in-depth discussion lessons, we are looking at what different religions believe about the creation of our world and drawing our own personal ideas from the information. Another learning packed week ahead for us - team Gannets!			
Falcons and Ospreys	This week, Year 5 and 6 have continued to delve into the delightful horror in Anthony Horowitz's stories, reading 'Killer Camera'. In writing, we edited and improved our horror stories that have been inspired by a short horror film, and begun to plan our own, unique horror stories, ready for our writing competition. In History, we continued to look at the Vikings and have learnt why they chose to settle in Britain, the significance of the Danelaw and the Treaty. In maths, Year 5 have continued our journey through the wonderful world of addition and subtraction. Year 6 have focused on prime numbers before we move on to multiplication.	Next week Year 5 & 6 will conclude our spooky stories unit, by finishing our reading of Horowitz Horrors with 'The Man with the Yellow Face'. We will continue to write our own spooky stories ready for the spooky story competition. In topic we will continue to delive into the world of the Vikings, learning the impact they had on our world today. In science, we will learn about thermal insulators and thermal conductors and plan our hot chocolate experiment to find the best thermal insulator. In maths, Year 5 will begin our journey into the world of multiplication and division. Year 6 will finish investigating multiplication and progress into the world of division.
